Friday, November 2

Special pre-meeting afternoon cook-out and field trip at Yuchi Wildlife Refuge in Rhea County

11:30 a.m. - Meet at the visitor's overlook parking area on the west side of Watts Bar dam. If you take Hwy 68 from I-75, this parking area will be the first one on your right after you cross the dam. We'll caravan to the refuge from there.**12:00 noon** - Lunch provided at Yuchi by TWRA. **1:00 p.m.** - Short TWRA Program on Yuchi Refuge management, access, etc. **1:45 p.m**. - Birding Field Trip. Participants can leave any time after lunch that they wish. This will provide plenty of time to get to the TOS registration by 6:30 p.m. and potluck supper that will follow.

6:30 p.m. - Registration, Potluck Dinner, and Reception at the Days Inn, Alcoa Hwy. Food provided by KTOS members. Sign up for field trips. Begin bidding on items in the silent auction (see below).

7:30 p.m. Informal slide presentation by members. Bring a few of your favorites and share them.

Saturday, November 3

7:15 a.m. - Field Trips to Townsend and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, Kyker Bottoms Wildlife Refuge, and other locations.

2:00 p.m. - Paper Session - A series of presentations on recently completed and ongoing studies of Tennessee birds. The paper session is being coordinated by Dr. David Buehler of the University of Tennessee.Board of Directors Meeting - begins15 minutes after the paper session.

7:30 p.m. Evening program. Birds of the Dominican Republic, presented by Eladio Fernandez.

SILENT AUCTION

KTOS will be holding a silent auction of bird-related items. Proceeds from this auction will go to the J.B. Owen Memorial Fund as well as the Foothills Land Conservancy, which is trying to purchase land adjacent to the Foothills Wildlife Management Area in Blount County. Feel free to bring items to donate to this auction (e.g., books, magazines, bird feeders, houses, binoculars). Bidding will begin Friday evening and close Saturday evening.

FIELD TRIPS

Field trips will depart Saturday and Sunday mornings at 7:15. Saturday:Great Smoky Mountains National Park. Leader: Charlie Muise (cmmbirds@yahoo.com). This trip will likely concentrate on areas in Cades Cove. Some of the birds possible include: Red-shouldered Hawk, Wild Turkey, Eastern Phoebe, Brown Creeper, Golden-crowned Kinglet, Blue-headed Vireo, Pine Warbler, sparrows, Pine Siskin, Red Crossbill. Black Bear is a possibility.

Saturday: Kyker Bottoms and Chota Waterfowl Refuge.

Leader: Chuck Nicholson (cpnichol@bellsoutn.net). You will overlook some of the wetlands at Kyker Bottoms where a good number of waterfowl is possible. Sparrows should be plentiful here, including White-crowned. Raptors are often seen over the fields. Loggerhead Shrike and Red-headed Woodpeckers are possible. The Toqua beach boat ramp on Tellico Lake is a potential stop, where Fox Sparrow is often found. Chota Waterfowl Refuge should have a few ducks, plus grebes and loons. Bald Eagle is often seen here, and we'll stop and view an eagle nest enroute to the refuge.

Sunday:Kingston Steam Plant. Leader: Chris Welsh

(cwelsh@utk.edu). This trip was planned partly because it will be on the way home for most Middle and West Tennessee birders. Of course, this can be one of the best birding sites in the Knoxville area. Sometimes hundreds of ducks are seen here, along with a few late shorebirds. Sparrows can be plentiful, including Vesper Sparrow. The marshes may hold a Sora or Rusty Blackbirds. Bald Eagle is possible, as are Snow Geese.

***If there is interest, there may be a trip to the high elevations of the Smokies. Leader: David Trently (dtrently@utk.edu). Traffic may be a problem getting out of the Park after the trip, especially if the weather is nice and there are still lots of colorful leaves on the trees. We will be looking for Ruffed Grouse, Common Raven, Pine Siskin, Red Crossbill, Red-breasted Nuthatch, Black-capped Chickadee, and more.

He'll discuss issues including Owl habitat; use of agricultural lands; human and other pressures; and population censusing. He will also explain some of the interesting research being done, involving creating artificial burrows, banding, and behavioral experiments. Though the talk will be on scientific ideas, it is aimed at a wide audience.
