October Field Trips

Sunday, October 7, 7:00 am, Field trip to northwestern Georgia, with members of the Chattanooga Chapter of TOS Leader from Knoxville. Leave from Stokely Bldg at 7:00 a.m. Meet with Chattanooga members around 8:30 at a site to be determined. We will visit a few sites in this mountain region of Georgia, including the Crockford-Pigeon Mountain WMA for Golden Eagle. Other possible stops include Cloudland Canyon State Park, Arrowhead Wildlife Education Center, a sod farm and Pine Log WMA. This will be an all-day trip. Saturday, Oct 13, 8:00am Field trip to **Ijams Nature Center/Forks of the River WMA**. This will be an easy walk around Ijams and a section of the Greenway in Forks of the River WMA. We will be looking for local residents, passing migrants and winter species. Several species of sparrows are regularly present. This is a good walk for beginners.

Sunday, Oct 21, 2:00 pm- Field trip to **Kingston Steam Plant** Meet in the Stokley Building Parking lot at 320 North Cedar Bluff Rd. We will be looking for migrating waterfowl, late shorebirds, terns, sparrows and brown-headed nuthatches. Sedge wrens and marsh wrens are a possibility.

There will be several informal field trips the weekend of Oct 27, 28. Field trip leader for the fall meeting will be scouting their field trips to get an idea where they might find birds for the following weekend. Contact any of the field trip leaders and I am sure they will be glad to have help scouting.

Field trip reports:

Sept 16, Cherohala Skyway. Six people attended this trip. There was a good number of birds at the first two stops, but after that it was hard to find birds. Just a few of what we did find: Philadelphia Vireo, singing Blackthroated Blue Warbler, Scarlet Tanagers, and heard a couple of Common Ravens.

Sept 23, Foothills Parkway Hawk Watch. First people to arrive were treated to more warblers than we could look at! but then it quieted down, but we still had a few small groups of songbirds before going up to the hawk watch site. Some of the songbirds included Red-breasted Nuthatch, Philadelphia Vireo, American Redstart, Blackburnian, Black-throated Green, Chestnut-sided, Tennessee, Bay-breasted and Palm Warblers, Rose-breasted Grosbeaks, Scarlet Tanagers. We had at least 6 raptor species including well over 100 Broad-winged Hawks, 2 Osprey and an unidentified falcon that may have been a Peregrine. The pot luck lunch went really well (thanks for the chili, Tony!), we had beautiful weather, and just enough hawks to keep it interesting.
