KTOS October Meeting: Speaker Morton Massey

October's meeting will be about the different types of birding apps that you can load and use on your smartphone. We will cover apps that are used for reporting your sightings, field guides, helping to identify birds from photos or recordings and bird locaters. There are apps now for beginners all the way up to the fanatics. Come see how technology is greatly improving birdwatching in the field with the use of your cell phone.

The 7th Annual Wonder of the Hummingbirds Festival

On August 26th, at Ijams Nature Center, the 7th Annual Wonder of Hummingbirds Festival gave people the excitement of watching hummers being banded and listening to some great talks on birds, butterflies, plants and nature. This annual festival is an awesome way to reach people and help them to enjoy more of what nature has to offer and the estimated attendance of 850 people visiting the banding and various speakers' programs enabled Ijams to provide 642 educational hours.



The public is getting the message to arrive early if they want to see the hummingbirds banded although we did have to turn several disappointed late arriving folks away. Our hummingbird numbers were up this year! We banded 24 hummingbirds (4 adult males, 8 adult females, 10 young males, 2 young females) plus 2 Goldfinches and 1 Carolina Wren compared to 14 hummers in 2016. In 2015 we banded 26 hummers with one recapture form 2013. Interestingly, Mark recaptured one hummer at his house from the 2015 festival 7 days later. The hummer's weight had increased from 2.9 to 3.3 grams in seven days. In 2014 we had 33 hummingbirds!

A big thanks, as always, goes to Mark Armstrong our master-bander as this festival would not be possible without him. Also I want to thank the banding team, Jane Kading, Patty Ford, Eddy Whitson, Richard, Gar and Keane Secrist, Steve McGaffin and Colin Leonard along with all the other KTOS members who helped to make this a special day.

A big thank you goes to Ijams Nature Center for taking over the festival duties from KTOS and continuing this great educational event.
