DECEMBER SPEAKER - Mark Armstrong Seven Islands Wildlife Refuge

Although volunteer work started in 2005, Mark started his banding work in 2007 setting up MAPS stations sponsored by the Institute for Bird Populations (IBP), which looks for population declines in breeding and wintering habitats. MAPS Banding sessions are held from May through August. Twelve nets are set up at the same location during each session and are opened 30 minutes before sunrise. The nets are checked every 30-40 minutes and are open for 5 hours per session. After MAPs sessions are also held at SIWR throughout the year. 74 species and a total of 3,497 birds have been banded at Seven Islands.

NOVEMBER SPEAKER - Scott Somershoe - TWRA Birding in Southern California - August 2010 & Ebird Primer

Scott provided a slide show with narrative on the various locations he visited around southern California for birding including: Ventura County, Salton Sea, Malibu Lagoon, CA Lutheran University, Oxnard Plains, Ynez River, Maricopa, and Los Padres National Forest.

Some of the bird species he encountered included: Snowy Plover, Brewer's Blackbird, Wrentit, California Towhee, Cactus Wren, Lark Sparrow, Anna's and Allen's Hummingbird, Spotted Owl, Le Conte's Thrasher, Sage Sparrow, Golden Eagle and California Condor.
