### Knox County Spring Count

The Knox County Spring Count will be held on Sunday, April 21, 2013. Please contact the compiler [Dean Edwards, (865) 660-9701, <u>kde@utk.edu</u>] if you are interested in participating. If you normally participate but will not be able to do so this year, please let Dean know in advance so he can assign someone else to cover that territory.

Everyone is welcome and encouraged to participate by either joining a field party or counting birds in your own neighborhood (assuming you live in Knox County) similar to Project Feederwatch and the Great Backyard Bird Count.

Submit your results to Dean as soon as possible after the count is completed. Results should include: (a) checklist with numbers of each species observed, (b) location covered, (c) time of day you started and stopped counting, (d) separate tallies of miles and hours travelled by foot, car, etc., (e) tally of miles and hours spent owling, (f) tally of hours spent feeder watching, and (g) names of all participants with contact information for at least one person in the party.

You may also be asked to provide documentation for any rare or unusual species. If you plan to participate or have any further questions, please contact Dean.



## April Program: Birding along the French Broad and Tennessee Rivers

Join us on <u>Wednesday, April 3, at 6:45 p.m.</u> for a presentation by Michael Sledjeski and Leslie Gibbens about birding from the upper reaches and Rankin Bottoms area of Douglas Reservoir, down through the floodplains of Ten Islands, Dutch Bottoms, and Taylor Bend about 40 miles east of Knoxville. This area is best known for the outstanding numbers of migratory shorebirds and long-legged waders during the late summer and early fall. Michael and Leslie have been exploring their program, they will discuss birds and birding in this area, and show photographs of what they have seen there over the years.

# 2013 TOS Spring State Meeting Knoxville, April 26 – 28, 2013

The Knoxville chapter has invited all state TOS members to the 2013 spring meeting, to be held April 26–28. Friday night registration will be held at the conference hotel from 6–9 p.m., while Saturday afternoon meetings and the Saturday banquet will be hosted at the Knoxville Zoo, located off I-40 at Exit 392. Half-price tickets to the zoo for Saturday afternoon are available by mail-in, advance purchase only.

The conference hotel is the Clarion Inn, 5634 Merchant Center Boulevard (I-75, exit 108). A block of rooms is reserved at a discounted rate of \$62.00 plus taxes per night for a choice of a room with either two double beds or one king size bed. A free continental breakfast is included. Make your reservations for the hotel by April 10 by calling (865) 687-8989 and mentioning "TOS" for the discounted rate. All field trips will leave from the Clarion Inn.

We are pleased to announce that the speaker for the Saturday banquet will be Dr. Jim Tucker. ## **Birding Briefs**

**Tony King** lead a group birding at The Cove of Concord Park on March 21, 2013. The following species were observed: Canada Goose; Mallard; Pied-billed Grebe; Horned Grebe; Double-crested Cormorant; Great Blue Heron; Osprey; Killdeer; Bonaparte's Gull; Ring-billed Gull; Mourning Dove; Yellow-bellied Sapsucker; Downy Woodpecker; Blue Jay; American Crow; Tree Swallow; Carolina Chickadee; Brown-headed Nuthatch; Carolina Wren; Eastern Bluebird; American Robin; Northern Mockingbird; European Starling; Palm Warbler; Yellow-rumped Warbler; Northern Cardinal; Common Grackle; and American Goldfinch.
