American Birding Association

Are you familiar with the American Birding Association (ABA)? This is a group created for birders, originally for those who like to keep lists of the birds they identify around the country. While that is still a part of it, there is so much more, as you will see if you check out their website: http://www.americanbirding.org/

The thing that first got me interested in ABA was their book store. You can find books to help with birding in every state and most countries of the world.

As a member, you receive *Birding*, their bimonthly magazine. This has articles that can sometimes be on the technical side, but also very readable stories about birds and birding, reviews of books, optics, and a challenging bird quiz.

You will also receive the newsletter, *Winging It*, which includes information about current sightings of rare birds, plus birding site descriptions and more.

On their website is a monthly bird quiz. This is a good way for you to improve your ability to identify birds in the field.

For those who like to keep lists of their sightings, once a year you can submit your lists of birds found in each state, plus other regions. This will help you keep track of how many new birds you find each year.

The ABA offers a lot more than just this. Go to their website and see if it is right for you

J.B. OWEN MEMORIAL AWARD for Welfare and Conservation of Birds in Tennessee

The J.B. Owen Memorial Endowment honors the memory of J.B. Owen, longtime Tennessee Ornithological Society (TOS) member who was widely known through his popular columns in Knoxville newspapers. The Endowment provides funds for the annual J.B. Owen Award, with expected value of \$250 to \$500 per year.

The J.B. Owen Award is open to anyone with a project that promotes the welfare and conservation of birds in Tennessee. Applicants are encouraged to submit:

- Cover letter with short project description and applicant contact information
- Resume
- Project proposal, of up to three pages, showing topic of the project, problem to be addressed, objectives, expected results and significance, deliverables (for example, written report, journal article, presentation), project location, and project schedule.

Each year, applications are due by May 1 and should be sent by e-mail to jiadmj@infionline.net or mailed to Jean J. Alexander, 3908 Riverview Drive, Maryville, Tennessee 37804. The J.B. Owen Endowment Committee of the Knoxville Chapter of TOS will evaluate applications and will typically announce the Award winner the following September.

Some Previous Owen Award winners are:

- 2003: Jennifer Powers, of East Tennessee State University, for support of graduate research on the reproductive success and natal dispersal of American Kestrels;
- 2004: Samuel deMent of Greenwood, SC, David Vogt of Chattanooga, and Keith Hobson of Saskatoon, SK Canada for support of the project on Stable-isotope feather analysis and foreign band encounter comparisons of wintering American Kestrels in similar habitats west and east of the Southern Appalachians.
- 2005: Ijams Nature Center of Knoxville, Tennessee, for support of educational outreach programs.
- 2006: Jim Giocomo of Knoxville, for support of his project on *Northern Saw-whet Owl Monitoring in Knox County, Tennessee*; and Mark Armstrong of Knoxville, for support of *The MAPS (Monitoring Avian Productivity Station) at Seven Islands Wildlife Refuge.*
- 2007: J. Keith Watson of Sevierville for his project Breeding Bird Survey of Soak Ash and Cattail Wetland Habitats in Great Smoky Mountains National Park.
