KTOS unveiled its new educational booth at the annual Hummingbird Festival at Ijams Nature Center on Saturday, August 24th. Packed with an array of bird related informational handouts, optical equipment and a bird stand loaded with birdhouses and feeders, several KTOS volunteers greeted visitors and went about answering their questions on bird and birdwatching topics.

We are excited to be in a position to offer a real service when we go out and attend festivals and other events said Tony Headrick. We had several new rack cards providing tips about everything from how to feed hummingbirds to how to prevent bird window strikes. We also had bird books, bird checklists and information about where to bird across the state. If they had a question, we had an answer Tony said.

## **Letter from the New Officers**

Over the summer the new officers of KTOS met several times to get our team organized and to set some objectives for the upcoming year. It was agreed that our biggest challenge was to do more to grow our membership to combat the gradual decline we have been experiencing over the last 5 years. So moving forward we are going to be offering more bird walks and other types of educational programs aimed at new birders with the hope when can attract new members.

We have also been paying close attention to making sure we are balancing our efforts on all three areas of KTOS's mission. We exist to 1) promote birdwatching, 2) educate the public about birds and 3) engage in conservation efforts that involve birds.

Our first initiative was to create a new format for our KTOS booth at the Hummingbird Festival focused on education.
